Much of the debate about global warming has focused on its impact on humans, but there is evidence that it will be even more devastating for animals. In fact, a recent study of 1,500 animal species in the journal Nature found that 80 per cent of those species had already suffered some negative consequences because of climate change. Furthermore, the International Union for the Conservation of Nature estimates that 47 per cent of the mammals on the "Red List" of highly endangered species will face further threats if global warming continues.

On way in which global warming is already becoming apparent in some parts of the world is the loss of vegetation due to the rising temperatures. If this continues, it will force many animal species to move away from their natural habitats to look for food. The most **vulnerable** species are those having a very specialized food such as koalas, which survive almost entirely on eating eucalyptus as their source of nourishment. Meanwhile, the changes to seasons such as warmer springs, are disrupting the seasonal awareness of birds and causing them to migrate earlier. Unless more people become aware of this environmental crisis and pressure is put on governments to act, more animal species around the world will be at risk of extinction.
