



Present tenses

32 I'm Sam.

I'm Sam. He isn't ready. Are they here?

We use *be*:

- to say who somebody is or what something is: *I'm Sam. That's my ticket.*
- to describe something or somebody: *Your shoes are nice. He's tall.*
- to say where somebody is from: *He's American. We're from Brazil.*
- to talk about people's jobs: *She's a teacher. My father's a doctor.*
- to talk about somebody's age: *I'm nineteen. Sally's twenty one.*
- to say how we feel: *We're tired. He's angry.*
- to say where somebody or something is: *She's at home. Your bag's on the chair.*
- to talk about somebody's health: *I'm fine. Kate's ill.*

Affirmative	Negative	Question
I'm (am)	I'm not (am not)	Am I?
he/she/it's (is)	he/she/it isn't (is not)	Is he/she/it?
you/we/they're (are)	you/we/they aren't (are not)	Are you/we/they?

Short answers	Yes, I am.	Yes, he/she/it is.	Yes, you/we/they are.
	No, I'm not.	No, he/she/it isn't.	No, you/we/they aren't.
