<b>Am</b> I <b>playing</b> ?	Yes, I <b>am</b> . / No, I'm <b>not</b> .
<b>Is</b> he/she/it <b>playing</b> ?	Yes, he/she/it <b>is</b> . No, he/she/it <b>isn't</b> .
<b>Are</b> you/we/they <b>playing</b> ?	Yes, you/we/they <b>are</b> . No, you/we/they <b>aren't</b> .


