

Parrots

What is a Parrot? Imagine walking into your friend's kitchen. You call their name and ask, 'Where are you?' Then you hear your exact words echoed back to you in the same tone. You look around, expecting to see another person, but you notice a colorful bird in a cage instead. You are looking at a parrot!

Parrots are colorful birds that have large, hooked beaks, and some are known to copy the way people talk. There are more than 350 different kinds of parrots, but they all have some things in common with each other.

Parrots can get very old and usually live to be around 60. However, many live even longer than that, reaching about 100 years. That is a lot of candles on a birthday cake!

The smallest kind of parrot only grows to be about three and a half inches tall, which is less than half the length of an unsharpened pencil. The biggest parrot can grow to more than three feet tall.

All parrots have eight toes in all, with four on each foot. Two toes grow out forward and two point backward, making it easy for parrots to grab branches and push through thick leaves. These feet also make them great at climbing up the trunks of trees, and they are probably better at it than you are since all your toes face forward.
