

THERE IS / THERE ARE

● Pour dire « il y a ».

– *There is* + nom singulier.
There is a garden.

– *There are* + nom pluriel.
There are flowers.

● Questions.

Is there? *Are there?*

Is there a cellar?
Are there any books?

● Phrases négatives.

There is not (isn't) ; there are not (aren't).

There isn't a fire-place.
There aren't any pictures on the wall.

● *There* + *be* se conjugue à tous les temps.
