Past simple: regular and irregular verbs

I	learnt to walk		I		ten months old.
He	started nursery school		he		one.
She	moved house	when	she	was	three.
You	got a pet		you	were	five.
We	went on a plane		we		seven.
They	wrote a story		they		eight.



We use **Did** to ask questions about the past.

Did you learn to walk when you were one?

Yes, I **did**. No, I **didn't**.
