



# ADVERBS

## FORMATION OF ADVERBS:

Adjective = Adverb	
• We usually form an adverb by adding <b>-ly</b> to an adjective:	bad = <b>badly</b>
• Adjectives ending in <b>-le</b> drop <b>e</b> and take <b>-y</b>	simple = <b>simply</b>
• Adjectives ending in <b>consonant + -y</b> drop <b>y</b> and take <b>-ily</b> :	angry = <b>angrily</b>
• These adverbs are <b>irregular</b> :	good = <b>well</b>
	fast = <b>fast</b>
	hard = <b>hard</b>
	far = <b>far</b>
	late = <b>late</b>
	early = <b>early</b>
	high = <b>high</b>
