

Possessive adjectives – Possessive Pronouns

We use The Possessive Adjectives (MY-YOUR-HIS-HER-OUR-THEIR) before a PERSON or a THING.

Possessive Pronouns.

Tom and I have got a dog each. ~~His dog~~ **his** is a husky and ~~my dog~~ **mine** is a Rottweiler.

This is my friend Angela and her dog Daisy. My dog's name is Berty. I like ~~my dog~~ **mine** but I don't like her dog **hers**. It's got a bad temperament.



Objective Pronouns :

~~My book~~ → Mine ~~His dog~~ → His ~~Her book~~ → Hers ~~Our friend~~ → Ours – ~~Their teacher~~ → Theirs

We use Objective pronouns to avoid repetitions.
