Will: prediction

We use *will* to talk about a future event: something that we think or predict will happen.
We usually use the contraction *won't* (*will not*) for a negative prediction.
After *will* / *won't* we use the infinitive without *to*.

Countable and uncountable nouns (with is / isn't enough, are / aren't enough, is too much, are too many)

We use *too many* and *are / aren't enough* with countable nouns, and *too much* and *is / isn't enough* with uncountable nouns. We use these to talk about our opinion of the quantity of something.
