Did you know?

James Ford Murphy had the inspiration for this short film when he was on holiday in Hawaii in 2011. He learned about the existence of Lo'ihi, an underwater volcano which is growing next to the big island and will eventually merge with it. The main island is in fact the merging of five volcanoes. James started reflecting and wondered if the new volcano knew about the presence of the others and vice versa, which inspired him to write this lovely story. He learned to play the ukulele and composed the song. An important inspiration for the music was Israel Kamakawiwo'ole's version of "Somewhere Over the Rainbow." Murphy was interested in making a character that would also be a location. He said: "I thought it would be so cool to fall in love with a place who's also a character."
