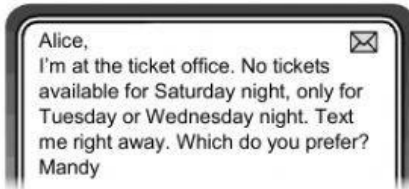

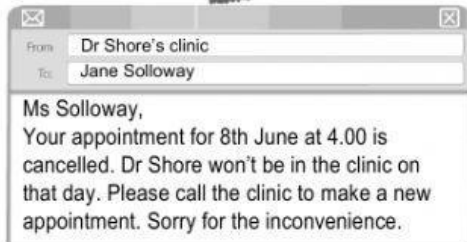

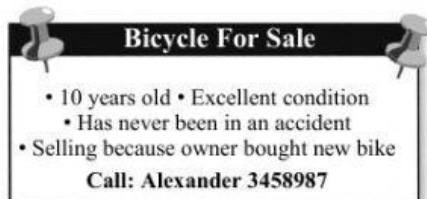

I have just come back from an amazing day in New Delhi, the capital of India. I saw many places in the city and I took some great photos in one of the markets. Here are some of the amazing photos I took!

The most interesting place we went to was the National Gandhi Museum. I had heard the name Gandhi before, but I didn't know much about him until today.

At the museum, I learned that Gandhi was a very special person. He was a small and quiet man. He dressed in simple clothes and lived in a very simple house. He didn't look or behave like a great leader, but he changed the history of India. The Indian people loved and admired Gandhi so much that they gave him the name "Mahatma", which means "Great Soul".

Mahandas Karamchand Gandhi was born in India in 1869. When he was 19, he went to London to study law. Then he moved to South Africa, where he worked as a lawyer. In 1915, Gandhi returned to India. At the time, India was ruled by the British and the British often treated the Indians badly. Gandhi believed that his country should be free, but he didn't believe in using violence. So he organised peaceful demonstrations against the British.

In the end, Gandhi succeeded. The British left India and it became an independent country in 1947. Sadly, Gandhi was shot and killed in 1948 by a man who didn't agree with his beliefs.
