

Present Simple - 3rd person

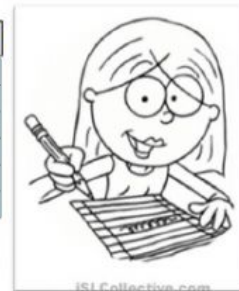

AFFIRMATIVE (+)		
Subject	+	Verb
I		sleep
You		sleep
He		<u>sleeps</u>
She		<u>sleeps</u>
It		<u>sleeps</u>
We		sleep
You		sleep
They		sleep

NEGATIVE (-)			
Subject	+	Negation	Verb
I		don't	sleep
You		don't	sleep
He		<u>doesn't</u>	sleep
She		<u>doesn't</u>	sleep
It		<u>doesn't</u>	sleep
We		don't	sleep
You		don't	sleep
They		don't	sleep

INTERROGATIVE (?)			
Auxiliar +	Subject	+	Verb
Do	you		sleep?
Does	he		sleep?
Does	she		sleep?
Does	it		sleep?
Do	you		sleep?
Do	they		sleep?

SHORT ANSWER	
Yes, I do / No, I don't	
Yes, he <u>does</u> / No, he <u>doesn't</u>	
Yes, she <u>does</u> / No, she <u>doesn't</u>	
Yes, it <u>does</u> / No, it <u>doesn't</u>	
Yes, we do / No, we don't	
Yes, they do / No, they don't	



Present Simple Tense - **He/She/It**
(3rd person singular)

1) In general: Verb + **s**

I **read** → she **reads**

I **walk** → he **walks**



2) Verbs ending in a vowel (a,e,i,o,u) + y

I **play** → he **plays**

I **say** → she **says**



BUT verbs ending in a consonant (b,c,d,f,..) + y

* I **study** → he **studies**

* I **fly** → it **flies**



3) Verbs ending in - o, ss, sh, ch, x, z + **es**

I **go** → She **goes**

I **do** → He **does**

I **wash** → He **washes**



I **kiss** → She **kisses**

I **miss** → He **misses**

I **watch** → She **watches**

I **catch** → She **catches**



I **fix** → She **fixes**

I **relax** → He **relaxes**
