Past Simple Affirmative - Regular Verbs

The past simple describes what happened in the past: yesterday, last year and so on. To form the past tense of **regular verbs**, add **-ed**.

The form is the same for all subjects. (=I/you/we/they/he/she/it)

There are a few spelling rules:

- For verbs ending in -e, add -d
- For verbs ending in a consonant + y, change y to i and add -ed
- For most verbs ending in consonant + vowel + consonant, double the final consonant and add -ed.
