

Past Simple Affirmative - Regular Verbs

The past simple describes what happened in the past: yesterday, last year and so on. To form the past tense of **regular verbs**, add **-ed**.

The form is the same for all subjects. (=I/you/we/they/he/she/it)

There are a few spelling rules:

- For verbs ending in **-e**, add **-d**
- For verbs ending in a **consonant + y**, change **y to i** and add **-ed**
- For most verbs ending in **consonant + vowel + consonant**, **double the final consonant** and add **-ed**.
