Every Minute Counts!

Do you want to save people's lives? There are many jobs that you ¹ **should / can / must** choose from. You ² **must / need to / might** become a doctor or nurse. But there are other options and for some of these jobs, you ³ **mustn't / don't have to / shouldn't** study for years and years. One job that involves saving lives but isn't so well-known is the job of organ courier. Organ couriers take body organs, like hearts, from hospital to hospital and sometimes from country to country. They have got a lot of responsibility. They ⁴ **could / mustn't / must** get to their destination quickly or a patient ⁵ **should / might / may not** die. A heart, for example, ⁶ **needs to / shouldn't / can** find a new body within four hours or it ⁷ **doesn't have to / mustn't / might not** survive. Delivering an organ to a patient ⁸ **may / may not / can't** be a very emotional experience. On the one hand, a courier often ⁹ **must / couldn't / doesn't need to** wait for one person to die in order to get an organ, and on the other hand, another person is waiting anxiously with family members and doctors for the courier.
