On May 25th, George Floyd was killed on the street in Minneapolis, Minnesota. He died when a police officer, Derik Chauvin, kneeled on his neck for more than 8 minutes. Chauvin has been <u>charged</u> with <u>2<sup>nd</sup> degree murder</u>. The three officers who were with him, Tou Thao, Thomas Lane and J. Alexander Kuen, have been charged with aiding and abetting 2<sup>nd</sup> degree murder.

Now people of every colour, sex and age are <u>joining together</u> in anger and <u>protest</u>. Many of these protests have even become <u>violent</u>. These protests are happening across the state, across the country and across the world.

The reason for the protest is because <u>racism</u> is very strong, especially racism in the <u>justice</u> system in the United States. Black people are 2.5 times more likely to be killed by police officers every year. There are almost 5 times the number of black people in the jails than white. Black people are poorer and they have fewer opportunities. The <u>protesters</u> are fighting for change in the justice system. They are also fighting for change in the police system.

In Canada, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and many other politicians have <u>admitted</u> that there is systemic racism in Canada, too. Statistics show that more black and <u>indigenous</u> people are <u>arrested</u> and put in jail than white people. The government has promised to listen and find ways to improve the justice system in Canada. The murder of George Floyd is not the first murder at the hands of a police officer, but it has begun a new fight for change around the world.
