- d) In the next ten years, it will be a lot of hard training. So we'll have to build up all the skills that we won't have available to us whilst around Mars like dentistry, medicine, repair skills, how to grow our own food and stuff like that. We will also have to learn how to work as a team because we're going to have 3 other people on the ship with

us and we have to spend a long time with them in isolated conditions.

e) No, I think it would be really amazing to be the first woman to give birth on Mars because no research has gone into the effects of gravity on a fetus, nobody knows if it will work. [...] When we first go to Mars, it's not really going to be a suitable place to bring up a child, but in order

to create a human settlement, it will eventually happen.

f) We've got ten years to drop out at anytime we want, but the people we'll train with in the next ten years are literally the only people that we're going to be interacting with, so if I fall in love with someone, it will probably be with one of them and they'll become my new family.
