Grammar

AFFIRMATIVE

Sub. + am/is/are+ going to + verb + complement

- I am going to sunbathe.
- You are going to have a picnic.
- He is going to swim in the sea.
- She is going to go surfing.
- You are going to make sandcastles.
- We are going to have a barbecue.
- They are going to go fishing.

NEGATIVE

Sub. + am not/isn't/aren't+ going to + verb + complement

- I am not going to sunbathe.
- You aren't going to have a picnic.
- He isn't going to swim in the sea.
- She isn't going to go surfing.
- You aren't going to make sandcastles.
- We aren't going to have a barbecue.
- They aren't going to go fishing.

INTERROGATIVE

Am/is/are + sub. + going to + verb + complement + ?

- Am I going to sunbathe?
- Are you going to have a picnic?
- Is he going to swim in the sea?
- Is she going to go surfing?
- Are you going to make sandcastles?
- Are we going to have a barbecue?
