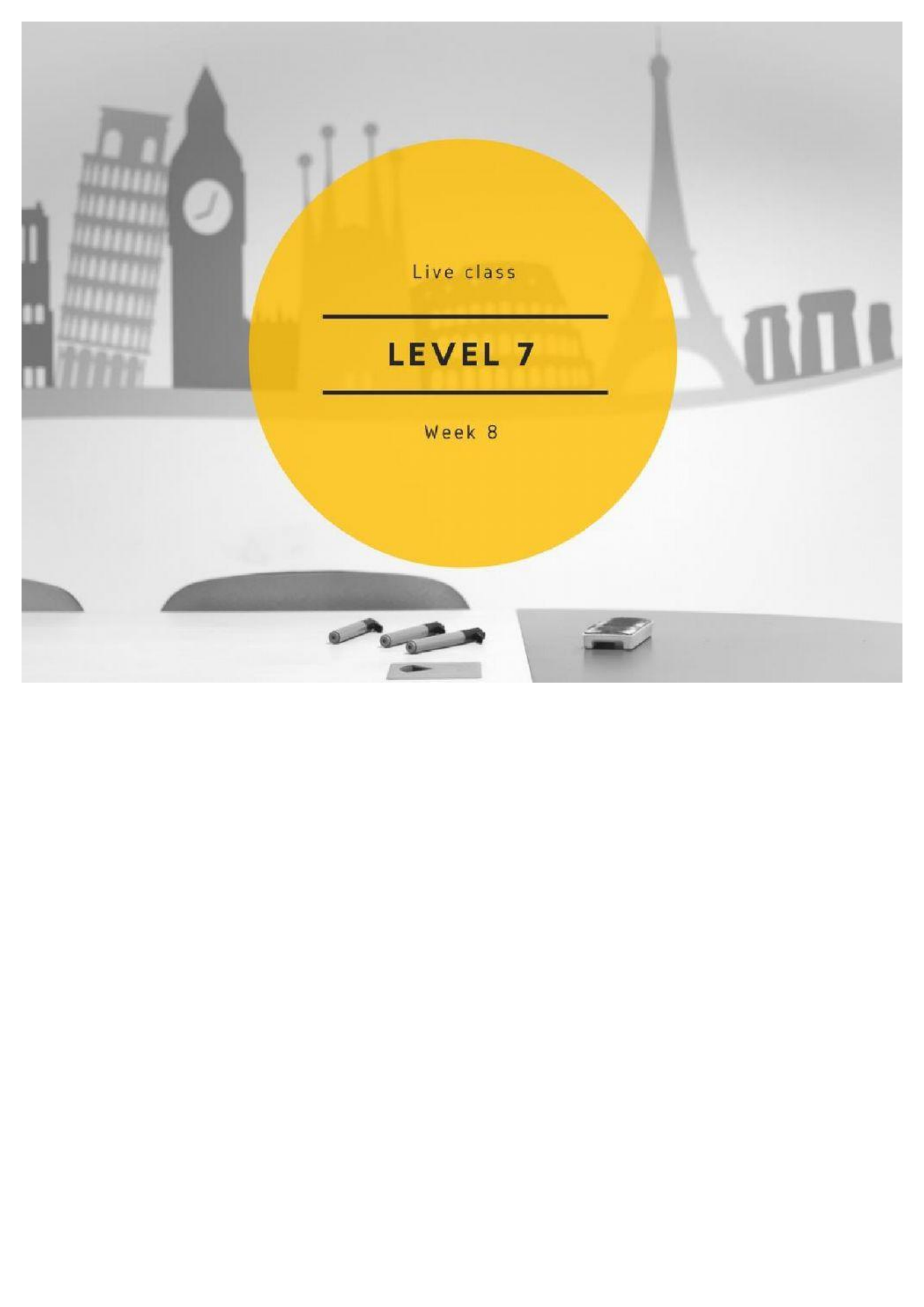

Past Simple vs Present Perfect

These two tenses often get mixed up by learners of English. Find out the differences below!

FORM:
Subject + Past
Verb (V2)



FUNCTION:

Used for a completed action in the past when the time is known.

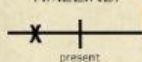


COMMON TIME PHRASES:

yesterday, last week, two days ago, last night etc.



TIMELINE:



EXAMPLE SENTENCE:

I ate grapes as a snack yesterday.



FORM:
Subject +
have/has + Past
Participle (V3)



FUNCTION:

Used for an action at an unspecified time before now or an unfinished time.

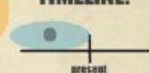


COMMON TIME PHRASES:

today, this week, this year, in my lifetime etc.



TIMELINE:



EXAMPLE SENTENCE:

I have eaten watermelon this week.

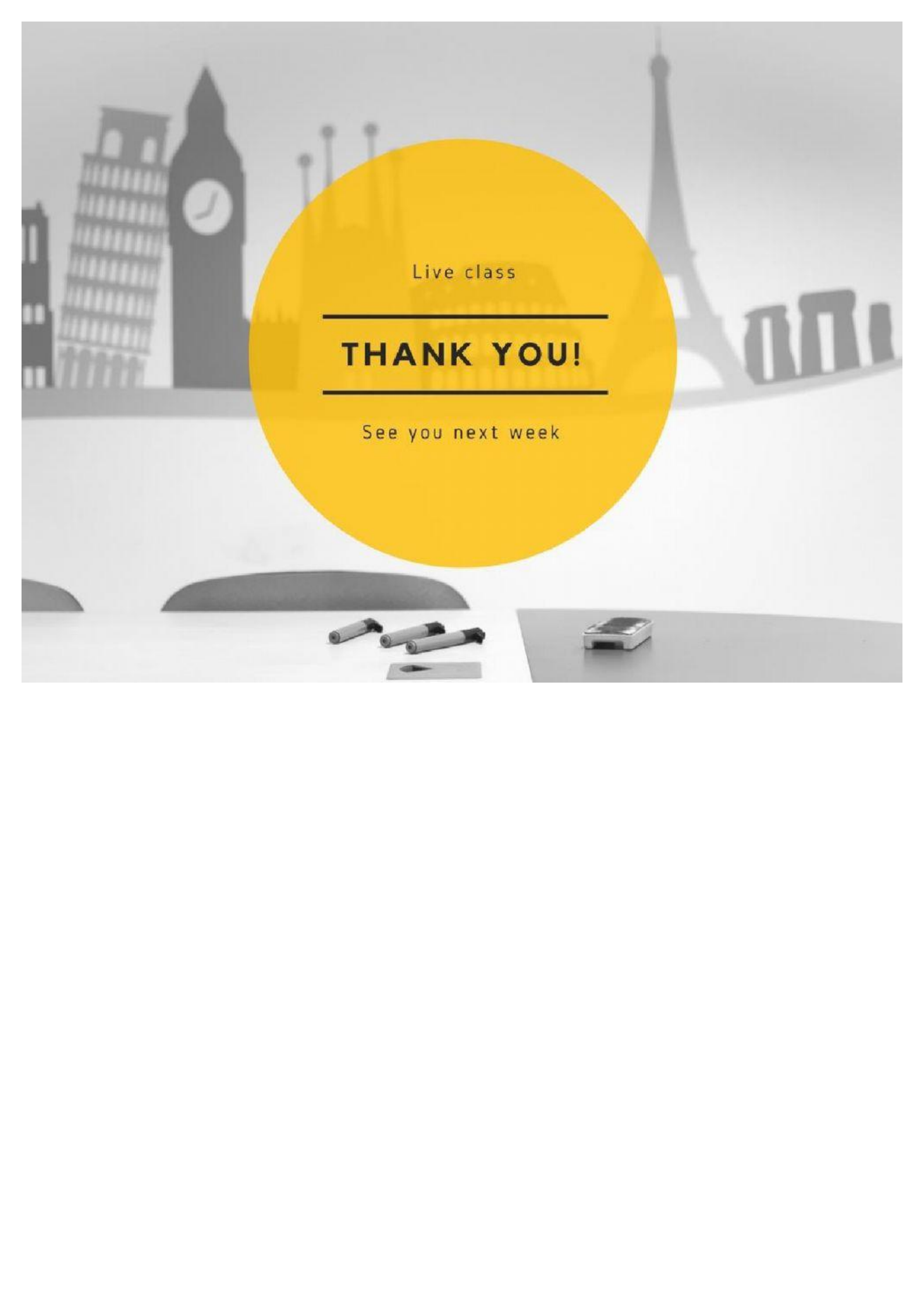
