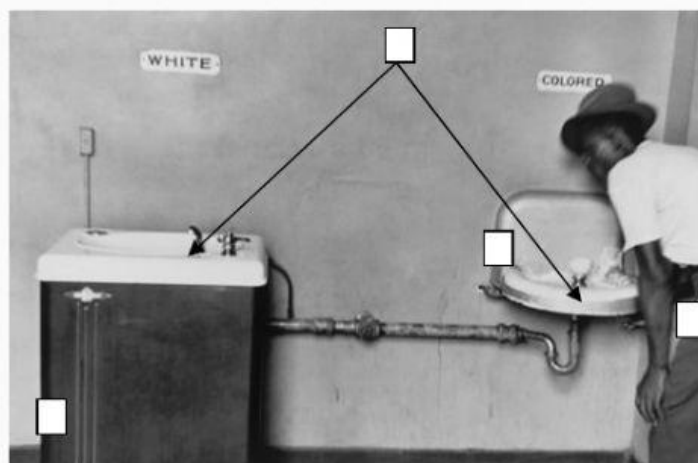

drink water from a smaller sink of lower quality.

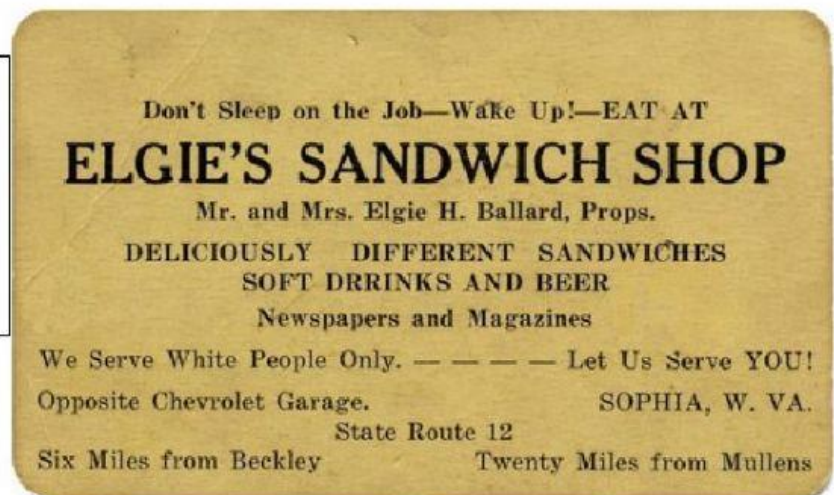


A black man goes into the "colored" entrance of a [movie theater](#) in [Belzoni, Mississippi](#), 1939.
