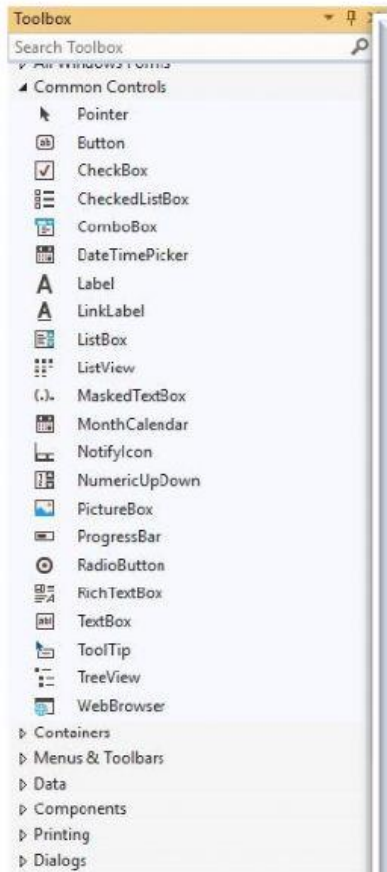


Visual Basic: Introduction to control tools
