You hear	You say
Can I help you?	Yes, please. I'd like to book a ...
Have you been here before?	Yes, I have. / No, I haven't.
When do you want to book (the session)?	On (Saturday) at (1 p.m.)
How many people are there?	(Ten.)

Look at the extract from the previous dialogue

Where does "have" go in questions?
And the past participle?

Receptionist Have you been here before?
Joe Yes, I have.

The position of "have" and the "past participle" differs from affirmative/negative sentences.
In sentences the structure is:

Subject + have/has + past participle + complement.

Receptionist OK. I've booked that for you.
Joe That's great. Thanks. Bye.

EVER / NEVER

Es muy común el uso de los adverbios EVER y NEVER en el Pretérito Perfecto Simple (Present Perfect).

💡 EVER significa “*alguna vez*”. Por lo general EVER se usa en preguntas (aunque suele aparecer en oraciones para ENFATIZAR el significado de NEVER).

💡 NEVER significa “*nunca*”. Se usa en oraciones afirmativas pero con sentido NEGATIVO. ¿cómo lo traducirías cuando está acompañado de EVER?
