

Noun Clauses

A **noun clause** is a dependent clause which takes the place of a noun in another clause or **phrase**. Like a noun, a noun clause acts as the **subject** or **object** of a verb or the object of a preposition.

Function Noun or Pronoun Noun Clause

Subject

His speech was clear.

What he said was clear.

Direct object

I don't know **his contact number**.

I don't know **how he can be contacted**.

1. Words that introduce noun clauses:

How	What	where	Which	Whoever
If	Whatever	Whichever	whoever	Whomever
That	When	Whether	who, which	Why

2. Noun clauses with Wh-words are indirect questions.

They have statement word order, even when they occur within questions

[Wh + subject + verb]

Examples:

Where I put my book is a mystery

What is he doing?

I don't know **what he is doing**.

How does he feel today?

I wonder **how he feels today**.
