

PRESENT PERFECT + JUST

Just — Se utiliza cuando la acción acaba “**justo**” de terminar. **NO** se usa nunca en frases negativas.

Se escribe: **have + JUST + past participle**



*la niña acaba **justo** de terminar de hacer el pastel

What **have** they **JUST** done?

The boy **has just stopped** next to the road

The girl **has just thrown** the ball



The girl **has just started** the race

The girl **has just crossed** the finish line



The plane **has just taken off** * (*despegar*)

The plane **has just landed** * (*aterrizar*)
