Angela Willis, 18

About me: I study international relations. I like reading.

Fears: It's the 'you only live once' motto. When I was at school, a guy laughed when I was talking to a friend about climate change. He said 'Even if you care, the Earth is going to end anyway.' I was furious. It's because of this attitude that more people don't help.

What gives me hope: I know I'm not the only one working to protect our planet. We're campaigning against pollution. We don't just live for the moment.

Karin Lopez, 21

About me: I'm an engineering student. I enjoy hiking.

Fears: I know many people who have never been camping, who cringe at the idea of spending a day outside the city, and who believe that the solution to the climate change crisis is to adopt another planet as our homeland. How can young people be expected to protect the environment if they don't get a chance to spend time enjoying nature?

What gives me hope: The organizations working to persuade politicians to take decisions to end climate change.

Simon Mwashinga, 23

About me: I'm a Master's student in environmental science.

Fears: There is a big knowledge gap in my country. The topic of climate change is only taught in secondary school in an optional geography course.
