## Change and continuity Independence and Gran Colombia

- Creole thoughts were influenced by various events and ideas that happened in the second half of the 18<sup>th</sup> century (the Enlightenment, the independence of the United States, the French Revolution, among other things) and which influenced the formation of a Mestizo consciousness and identity.
- The feeling of the residents of the Audiencia towards the Crown, which had previously been of support and loyalty, became distrust and anger during this period.
- America began to be thought of as a unit, as a whole, different from the other continents.
- Despite the participation of women in the independence process, in most cases, women continued to be discriminated against and relegated to the home and family care. Their participation in public life remained scarce.
- The Afro-Ecuadorians joined the independence campaigns because Bolívar offered to grant them freedom for their participation. However, this offer was not fulfilled and their position in society returned to what it previously was.
