

# Modal verbs

## 1 Presentation

We use the modal verbs **can**, **could**, **may**, **would**, **will** and **shall** for requests, offers, invitations and permission. Study the table below.

	Use	Examples
<b>can</b>	to ask somebody to do something to ask for or give permission to offer to do something	<b>Can you</b> help me? <b>Can I</b> have another chocolate? Yes, <b>you can</b> use my laptop. No, you <b>you can't</b> use my laptop. <b>Can I</b> help you with your bags?
<b>could</b>	to ask somebody to do something to ask for permission ( <i>more polite</i> )	<b>Could you</b> call me a taxi? <b>Could I</b> come to work a little later? Do you think <b>I could</b> borrow your phone?
<b>may</b>	to ask for or give permission ( <i>polite</i> )	<b>May I</b> speak to you for a second? Yes, <b>you may</b> use my laptop. No, <b>you may not</b> use my laptop.
<b>would you like</b>	to make an offer or invitation	<b>Would you like</b> another chocolate? <b>Would you like</b> to go out?
<b>will</b>	to ask somebody to do something	Peter, <b>will you</b> come here for a minute?
<b>would</b>	to ask somebody to do something ( <i>very polite</i> )	<b>Would you</b> carry my bags for me, please?
<b>shall I ...</b>	to offer to do something	<b>Shall I</b> answer the phone for you?

### Dialogue

**A:** **Would you like** to go for a walk in the park?

**B:** Sure. **Can we** go after lunch?

**A:** Of course. **Could you** meet me outside my building?

**B:** No problem.
