

# HAVE GOT/HAS GOT

## I. WRITE HAVE GOT OR HAS GOT.

Example → I *have got* a big dog.

1. Ann \_\_\_\_\_ a lot of money.
2. You \_\_\_\_\_ long hair.
3. They \_\_\_\_\_ a new house.
4. He \_\_\_\_\_ a beautiful boat.

## II. CHOOSE THE CORRECT FORM.

Example → I *have got* / *has got* a nice car.

1. He *have got* / *has got* a huge dog.
2. They *have got* / *has got* a big boat.
3. Jim *have got* / *has got* three dogs.
4. My father *have got* / *has got* two sisters.

## III. USE SHORT FORMS. ('S GOT / 'VE GOT)

Example → Sara *has got* a nice view from her balcony. → Sara *'s got* a nice view from her balcony.

1. They *have got* three dogs and five cats. → \_\_\_\_\_
2. I *have got* a cake in the fridge. → \_\_\_\_\_
3. Mary *has got* two brothers. → \_\_\_\_\_
4. We *have got* long hair. → \_\_\_\_\_
