

Passive sentences

The normal order of sentences in English is (the ACTIVE order):
subject (=agent) + verb + object + ...

To change active sentences into the passive:

1. Place the active **object** as subject in your passive sentence.
2. Use the verb '**be**' in the same tense as the active verb (and agreeing with the new subject!!).
3. Add the **Past Participle** form of the active verb.
4. If the active **subject** (agent) was important, add it with **BY**.

Example:

They **presented** the project yesterday.

The project **was presented** yesterday.

	Simple	Continuous	Perfect
Present	am is are	am being is being are being	have been has been
Past	was were	was being were being	had been
Future	will be	will be being	will have been
