### Knowing the band / song

- ✓ The English artist Gordon Matthew Summer, better known as STING, was born in Newcastle upon Tyne, England, on October 2, 1951. He is best known for his singing career, both with the 1980s band The Police and as a solo artist later.
- ✓ "Englishman in New York" is a song by Sting, from his second album *...Nothing like the sun*. **Englishman in New York** is a song by Sting, from his second studio album *...Nothing Like the Sun*, released in October 1987. Branford Marsalis played soprano saxophone on the track, while the drums were played by Manu Katché and the percussion by Mino Cinelu.

- ✓ The single was released in February 1988 as the third single from the album, but only reached #51 on the [UK Singles Chart](#).<sup>[1]</sup> In the US, "Englishman in New York" peaked at #84 on the [Billboard Hot 100](#) chart in April 1988<sup>[2]</sup> and reached #32 on the [Billboard Mainstream Rock chart](#) that same month.
- ✓ The "Englishman" in the song is the famous English gay icon, writer and actor Quentin Crisp, who was the inspiration of the song. In 1986, Crisp relocated from London, England to Manhattan, New York, and Sting wrote the song shortly after Crisp's relocation.
