'Omitting If' If cümleciklerinin kısaltmalarıdır. Formülü şöyledir;

Type 1 :

Should + Subj + V1, main Clause

If you finish your meal, you can eat your desert.

Should you finish your meal, you can eat your desert.

Type 2

Were + Subj, main Clause

Were + subject + to do, main Clause

If I were rich, I could buy a BMW car which I want.

Were I rich, I could buy a BMW car which I want.

If I knew how to speak French, I would work in France.

Were I to know how to speak French, I would work in France.

Type 3

Had + Subj + v3, Main Clause

If you had bought the summer house in Miami, we would have gone there last summer.

Had you bought the summer house in Miami, we would have gone there last summer.
