Character Foils

A technique an author uses to make his or her characters' traits more obvious to the reader is that of pairing foils. Two characters who are very different in terms of their traits, values, and goals will be placed together in several incidents in the novel. The purpose of employing this technique is to make the contrast even more visible; that is, to make the "bad person" seem very corrupt while highlighting the excellent qualities of the "good person."
