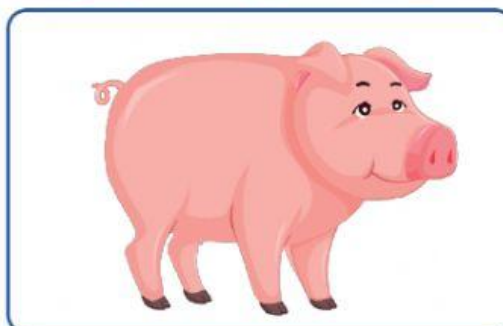

REMEMBER!!!

When we talk about actions that happened in a specific moment in the past, we use “Past Simple”.

For example:

- 1 I brushed my teeth yesterday.
- 2 They had a baby in august.
- 3 I started school in march.



1. **Regular verbs** in the past simple form you just need to add **-ed** or **-d** at the end of the verb.
2. **Irregular verbs** in the past simple form are completely different from its infinitive form.

Regular and Irregular verbs:

REGULAR VERBS	IRREGULAR VERBS
Work - Worked	Get - Got
Detect - Detected	Have - Had
Change - Changed	Make - Made
Bake - Baked	Think - Thought

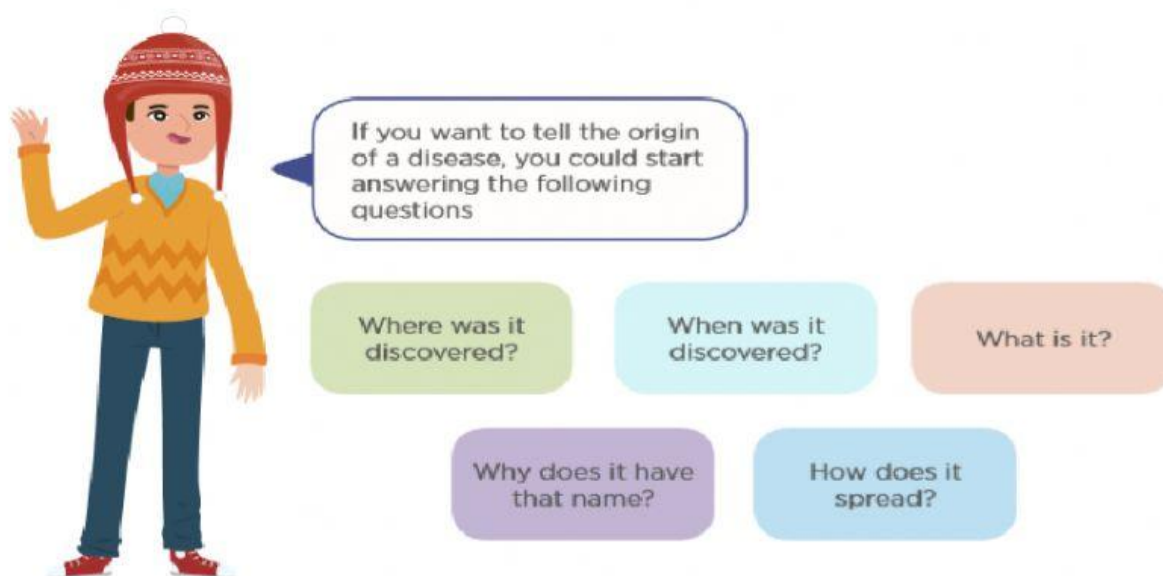
