Speaking Task – Creative/Expository task

You will have to select a character of your preference from Little Women by Louisa M. Alcott.

Then, you will select one of these programmes/web sites to create a presentation:

You can choose some other option but you must consult with your teacher first.

This will enable you to have visual support to help you go through the presentation of your character. This must include:

- 1) Physical description of the person
- 2) Description of the character's personality
- 3) Description of the clothes the person used to wear
- 4) An anecdote (in the form of a story using narrative tenses) that may or may not be connected to what happened in the plot of Little Women
- 5) A speculation in the present: saying what the person must/can't be doing
- 6) A speculation about the past

In your presentation, you will have to talk about the character. You will have the visual support of the project you created to aid you.

For each of the points above, use a variety of phrases:

- 1) a)The man/woman is wearing..., b)S/he looks..., c)S/he seems..., d)S/he is..., e)S/he has...
- 2) Use a variety of adjectives (you can check Unit 1)
- 3) S/he used to/ didn't use to/ wear... /S/he would...
- 4) Use a variety of narrative tenses and connectors of sequence (first, later, then, ... finally)
- 5) S/He must be... S/he can't be...
- 6) S/he must have been.../ S/he can't have been...
