My boyfriend and I went to Istanbul to celebrate our engagement last month. We needed it to be cheap and cheerful, and this book really helped us to do that. It doesn't just point you to the touristy places that cost a fortune. It also tells you about places that are off the typical tourist trail, where you can see a slice of more authentic Turkish life – this was exactly what we were looking for. It also has a detailed guide on where to dine if it's local cuisine you're after.

There are dozens of walks, clearly described and mapped, that take you all around the ancient parts of the city, including the 6.5km city wall walk from the Marble Tower to the Golden Horn. The book spells out all the things you can enjoy that won't cost you a penny – walking through the ancient Spice Bazaar, for example, was such a treat for all the senses. A fully comprehensive list of Istanbul's many religious sites tells you which you can visit for free.

We only scratched the surface of this amazing city in a long weekend. Next time we go, we'll be married – and we'll be taking our trusty guidebook with us again.
