who/that subject – cannot be omitted
(people)

who/whom/that object – can be omitted
(people)

The girl is talking with the teacher. The girl is the new student.
The girl **who is talking** with the teacher is the new student.
(subject + verb)

Sam is talking to a boy. The boy is his best friend.
(verb + object)

The boy **whom/ who/ that** Sam is talking to is his best friend.
The boy **to whom** Sam is talking is his best friend.
