- She was born 69 B.C.
- She the last pharaoh of Egypt and died in 30 B.C.
- Cleopatra was Macedonian; her family moved to Egypt when Alexander the Great invaded her hometown.
- Cleopatra to speak ancient Egyptian, but her first language was Greek.
- She had a relationship with the Roman ruler, Julius Caesar, and they had a called, Caesarion. Rome's help made Cleopatra's stronger.

- Julius Caesar was killed by his enemies in 44 B.C.
- Cleopatra met Mark Antony and they fought against Octavianus.
- Cleopatra and Mark Antony had a relationship and they had three children.
- Mark Antony's troops defeated by Octavianus.
- Mark Antony and Cleopatra committed suicide. She was just 39.
- Cleopatra's son, Caesarion, was also by the forces Octavianus so Egypt became a of Rome. It was known as Aegyptus.
