EXERCISES!!

Do you know the phrasal verb?

..... = Meaning: Become inaudible over the phone, usually because of a bad connection

..... = Meaning: To telephone someone again or to return a call

..... = Meaning: Call someone on the phone

..... = Meaning: When a telephone call finishes because of a bad connection

..... = Meaning: To be connected to a place by telephone

..... = Meaning: Wait for a short time (informal)

..... = Meaning: End a telephone call by putting the phone down

..... = Meaning: Wait for a short time

..... = Meaning: Answer the telephone call

..... = Meaning: Connect by phone

..... = Meaning: Speak louder

..... = Meaning: Telephone someone later

..... = Meaning: Finish talking on the phone

..... = Meaning: Disconnect using the power button

..... = Meaning: Connect using the power button

..... = Meaning: (A message) To communicate (to convey) a message to someone else

..... = Meaning: Call in by telephone to a central person or central point.
