When Thomas Edison invented the light bulb, he tried over 2000 experiments before he got it to work. A young reporter asked him how it (39) _____ to fail so many times. He said, «I never failed once. I invented the light bulb. It just happened to be a 2000-step process.»

Wilma Rudolph was the 20th of 22 children. When she was 4 years old, she contracted double pneumonia and scarlet fever, which left her with a paralysed left leg. At the age of 9, she removed the metal leg brace she had been dependent on and began to walk (40) _____ it. By 13 she had developed a rhythmic walk, which doctors said was a miracle. That same year she decided to become a runner. She entered a race and came in the last. For the next few years every race she entered, she came in the last. Eventually this little girl, who was told she would never walk again, went on to win three Olympic gold medals.
