| Affirmative | | |

| I / You / We / They | 've (have) | watered the plants. |
| He / She | 's (has) | |

| Negative | | |
|----------------------|-----------------------|------------------------|
| I / You We / They | haven't (have not) | watered the plants. |
| He / She | hasn't (has not) | |

Look!

Remember, we make the past participle of regular verbs by adding *ed* (or *d*) to the end.

wash → washed

breathe → breathed

The past participles of irregular verbs with don't follow a pattern.

hang → hung do → done
