A short time ago, Nick Moss was an ordinary school boy. Now he's a well-paid model who gets constant offers of work. He's the kind of success story which inspires thousands of young people around the world. Nick hadn't really considered becoming a model. It all started quite by chance when he was discovered by his sister Kate's modelling agency. Kate Moss is one of the best-paid models in the world. The agency took some photos of Nick and 'things went straight away' he says, still surprised.

However, if you think that a modelling career depends on 'looks' alone, you're wrong. For example, Tracy is a charismatic 15-year-old girl with fantastic looks. But her perfect face has never adorned the pages of fashion magazines. 'You have to have a good photo portfolio and also be part of a really good professional agency' she says.
