A man on the moon

On 21st July 1969, American astronaut Neil Armstrong opened the door of the lunar module, the Eagle, and walked outside. He was on the moon. He was the first man in history to walk on the moon. It was a fantastic moment.

And today, some people over 50 can remember where they were when Armstrong walked on the moon.

In November 1969, the Americans travelled to the moon again and everybody watched. In the 1970s, astronauts went on five more trips. But after that, the American government decided that they didn't want to spend millions and millions of dollars on trips to the moon. The last man on the moon was there in 1972.
