## Making a Complaint

Complaint (noun) - example: He made a complaint about his neighbour Complain (verb)- He complained about his neighbour

## A. Get someone's attention

a. I'm sorry, but...(problem)

b. Excuse me, but...

c. Could I speak to you?

B. Say the problem

a. There's a problem.

b. There is something wrong.

c. I have a problem with...(something)

C. Solve the problem

a. Compromise b. Do you mind...(verb+ing)

Example: Do you mind cutting the grass?

Do you mind

I want to talk to you. I don't want to cause a problem. I don't want you to feel bad.

Explain the problem

Find a compromise

## Dialogue

Ronald: Hi Steve.

Hi Ronald. How are you doing? I'm doing well. I'm sorry, but can I Steve:

talk to you a minute.

Ronald: Sure, Steve. What's wrong?

Well, I don't know if you know this. Your children are knocking at Steve:

my vines. I'm afraid it will break the branches. Do you mind telling

them not to pull on the vines? ...

Owen: Hi. Excuse me, Patsy, but can we talk for a minute.

Sure, Owen. What's the wrong? Patsy:

Owen: I hate to complain, but the grass in your yard is getting quite long.

The neighbourhood is starting to look messy. Would you mind

cutting it, please?

Owen: Oh, ...
