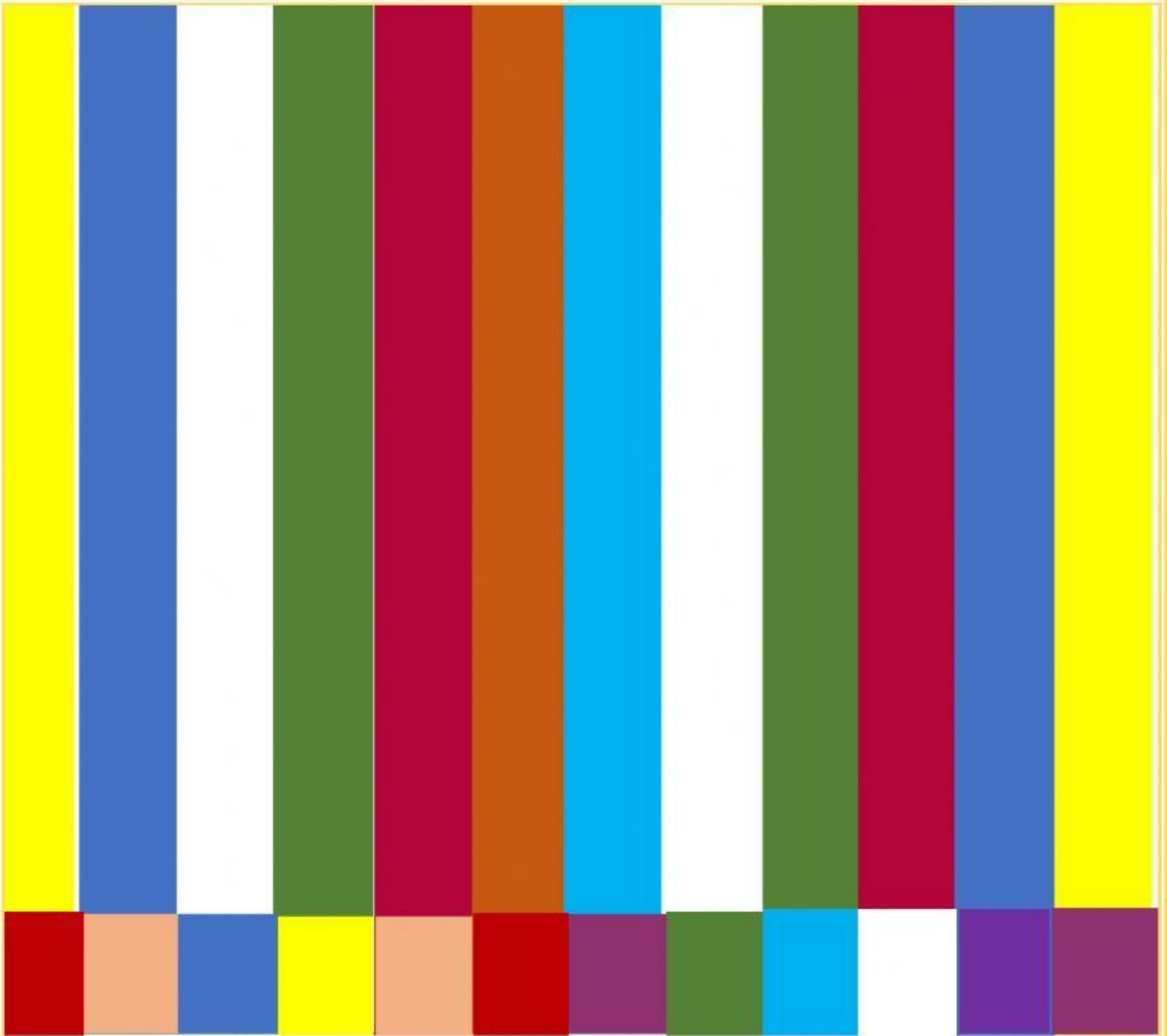


The Tower of Babel. Genesis 11:1-9

Memory Verse: "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labour in vain." **Psalms 127:1a.**







Activities:
