

**Examples:****Although**

We can use 'although' at the beginning or in the middle of a sentence. It is used in front of a clause (a clause has at least a subject and a verb that agrees with the subject).

- **Although** the weather is bad, I love London.
- I love London **although** the weather is bad.

**However**

However isn't used to connect two clauses. We usually put the two ideas in two separate sentences. We put 'however' in the second sentence, and we can put it at the beginning, at the end, or after the subject.

- I love London. **However**, the weather is bad.
- I love London. The weather, **however**, is bad.
- I love London. The weather is bad, **however**.
