

**Going To** for Predictions and Plans

For predictions based on evidence, or for future plans, use a present form of **be** + **going to** + **verb**.

Remember, the form of **be** can **be** a contraction.

<b>Affirmative</b>	I'm going <span style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 2px;"> </span> a garage sale.
	You're <span style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 2px;"> </span> harvest a lot of vegetables.
<b>Negative</b>	Teresa <span style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 2px;"> </span> give a speech tonight.
	They're <span style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 2px;"> </span> to have good weather this year.
<b>Interrogative</b>	Is it going to rain later? Yes, it is. / No, it <span style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 2px;"> </span> .
	Are you going to donate? Yes, we <span style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 2px;"> </span> . / No, we aren't.




