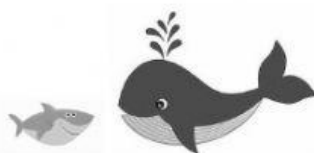

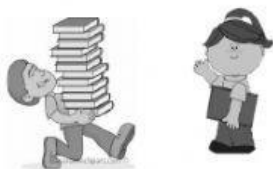

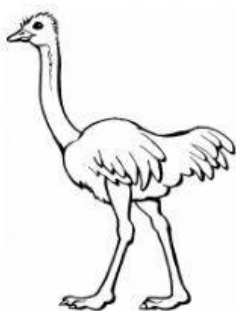
### **Ostriches: Giant Birds**

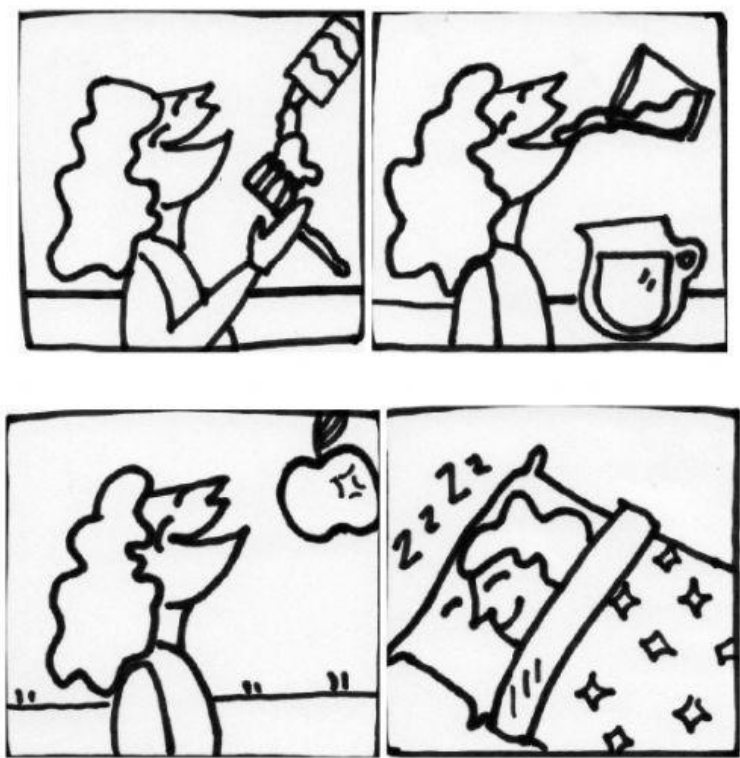
