Clothes can say a lot about who you really are. This is a short list about some typical clothing personalities and what they say about the wearer:

★ **The Sloppy Dresser:**
Sloppy clothing (wrinkled, stained or mismatched) sends the message that you do not care about your appearance, your life, your future, etc.

★ **The Designer Dresser:**
Every item on you is a brand name (Gucci, Prada, etc.) People may think you are successful but they may also think you are materialistic and insecure.

★ **The Flashy Dresser:**
You always have something colourful on: a tie, a handbag, a pair of shoes... You need to

show others your personality and get noticed.

★ **The Drab Dresser:**
You always dress in neutral colours and simple skirts (or trousers) and shirts. You really do not want a lot of extra attention from the others.

★ **The Athletic Dresser:**
You wear sports clothes 24 / 7: trainers, shorts, a tracksuit... You want to show others that you care about your body, but it could also mean that you are sloppy.

★ **The Casual Dresser:**
You never put on anything but jeans and a T-shirt. This look can make people think that you do not care much about fashion.

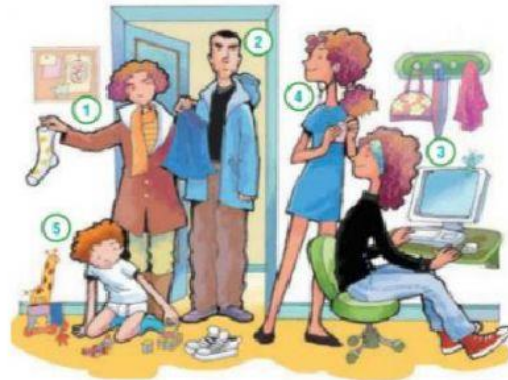

Possessive adjectives & Possessive pronouns - Whose?

	Possessive adjectives	Possessive pronouns
Whose shirt is this? = Whose is this shirt?	It's <u>my</u> shirt. It's <u>your</u> shirt. It's <u>his</u> shirt. It's <u>her</u> shirt.	It's <u>mine</u> . It's <u>yours</u> . It's <u>his</u> . It's <u>hers</u> .
Whose trainers are these? = Whose are these trainers?	They're <u>our</u> trainers. They're <u>your</u> trainers. They're <u>their</u> trainers.	They're <u>ours</u> . They're <u>yours</u> . They're <u>theirs</u> .

Remember! We use **possessive adjectives** before nouns to indicate possession (Whose?): This is my tie. Those are her shoes.
We use **possessive pronouns** to replace the underlined expressions above.
These pronouns are never followed by a noun: This is mine. Those are hers.

Useful Tip > Language

The shirt belongs to Bill. = It's Bill's.

The shirts belong to Bill and Joe. = They're Bill's and Joe's.
