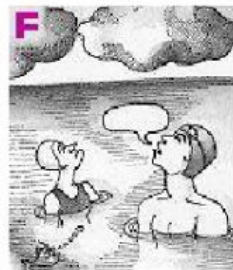


## FIRST CONDITIONAL
