When a number goes into the trumpet it doubles that number.

$$4 \times 2 = 8$$


$2 \times \text{trumpet} = \underline{\quad}$

$3 \times \text{trumpet} = \underline{\quad}$

$5 \times \text{trumpet} = \underline{\quad}$

A saxophone adds 4 to a number.

$$5 + 4 = 9$$


$4 + \text{saxophone} = \underline{\quad}$

$3 + \text{saxophone} = \underline{\quad}$

$1 + \text{saxophone} = \underline{\quad}$

See if you can solve these equations.

$2 \times \text{trumpet} + \text{saxophone} = \underline{\quad}$

$3 \times \text{trumpet} + \text{saxophone} = \underline{\quad}$

$2 \times \text{saxophone} + \text{trumpet} = \underline{\quad}$

$1 \times \text{saxophone} + \text{trumpet} = \underline{\quad}$

$2 \times \text{trumpet} + \text{trumpet} = \underline{\quad}$

$5 \times \text{saxophone} + \text{saxophone} = \underline{\quad}$
